NOFO Guidelines

- Total Award Amount: \$2,000,000 annually
- Project Period: SFY 21-2022 and 22-2023
 - July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022
 - July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023
- Eligibility
 - Public and private agencies in Nevada



Purpose/Objectives

Supports multiple goals of the 2018 Food Security in Nevada: Nevada's Plan for Action, including:

- Align and enhance collaboration efforts of state and nonstate agencies to strengthen statewide food security strategies;
- Support strategies to increase participation in state/federal nutrition programs;
- Support client-centered strategies to increase access to nutrition programs and resources that address determinants of hunger; and
- Establish evaluation and reporting processes to enhance data collection to drive future strategies and track progress in improving food security in Nevada.

Purpose/Objectives

All proposed projects must align with the following objectives:

- Provide cost effective services accessible, available, and responsive to the needs of individuals, families, and their communities;
- Foster a service delivery system responsive to the individual and cultural diversity of the people and communities served;
- Provide a comprehensive and integrated system of services to promote self- sufficiency; and
- Conduct a systematic evaluation of program activities to improve the effectiveness of the Funds for a Healthy Nevada monies.



Budget

Budget Funding Requirements: "All subrecipients must allocate 50% of requested funds towards procurement of foods that support a heathy diet. Up to 40% of the requested funds may be used for case management and personnel. Up to 10% of the funded amount may be reimbursed for indirect costs."



Review Process Summary

- Review Committee comprised of six (6)
 members, including three (3) Grants
 Management Advisory Committee (GMAC)
 members and representation from the Office of
 Food Security (OFS), Woman, Infants and
 Children (WIC), and the Aging and Disability
 Services Division (ADSD)
- Met five (5) times to discuss 17 proposals and develop recommendations
