Application 1:	Advocates to End Domestic Violence
Abstract:	The Positive Parenting Through Family Crisis is a secondary prevention program that provides intensive individualized training to survivors of domestic violence and at-risk families. The program goal is to prevent child abuse and neglect by developing positive skills, establishing structured and daily routine toward affecting long-term change that impacts survivors and their children’s lives. Positive Parenting begins by individually assessing parents’ skill levels, identifying areas for focus and improvement. The program works one-on-one with parents utilizing a 6-week evidence-based curriculum that incorporates pre-post tests, behavior modeling, home visits, nutrition, positive discipline, and behavior modification. A new component of the program will be a primary prevention social media campaign. The evidence-informed program will target at-large families in the community with engaging posts that build upon the Protective Factors to strengthen the parent-child bond.

Application 3:	Boys Towns- In-Home Services
Abstract:	Boys Town Nevada will provide a home-based family preservation and stabilization service through the In-Home Family Services (IHFS) model. Through this project, Boys Town Nevada will target at-risk families in Clark County, aiming to decrease the rate of first-time victims of child maltreatment and first-time perpetrators of child abuse. Family preservation services will be provided remotely through the remainder of the state utilizing the guiding framework of our in-home services to build and strengthen parenting skills and child protective factors. To mitigate the Consultant 's inability to provide in-person crisis support, service delivery will be augmented by accepting referrals for low to moderate risk for child abuse/neglect, outreach with safety and mental health services in rural communities, virtual visits will also include children, and crisis supports will be available if a family is experiencing high stress or there aresafety concerns

Discuss the Pros of the overall project	Established program that is supported by a large national organization and long-time leadership at the local level. Good evidence-based program.
Discuss the areas of the project that were not clear	The application cites that the IHFS model is based on the evidence-based Teaching Family Model- however that model requires 9 months of 10-15 sessions in home per week, which is not the model described in the application. The actual program (IHFS) requesting funding is not rated as evidence-based by the California Clearinghouse (rated NR), and it is also hard to justify the very high price tag given 4 staff will need to be hired and will have no experience with the model. It is not clear how many families will be served outside of Clark County and the relationships there are weak.

The presentation of numbers is not quite explained correctly and because they are only presenting one year, they are not referencing that the number of cases is consistent.
