Nevada currently has nearly 14,000 nurses employed in a variety of fields and occupations.

DHHS employs more than 300 nurses, who work in the Aging Services, Child and Family Services, Health, Mental Health and Developmental Services, and Health Care Financing and Policy divisions. Currently, we still have more than 100 full-time positions unfilled.
