

SFY 2016 Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Distribution Formula

Column Descriptions:

Designated Community Action Agency These are the Community Action Agencies (CAAs) eligible to receive CSBG funding as defined in the State Plan for CSBG Services and the federal CSBG Act.

Base Allocation This factor is used to ensure that the smaller agencies in the state have a basic level of funding to meet the National Organizational Standards and ROMA requirements. The method for allocating these funds is based on the service area population of each CAA according to the 2013 Census Data estimates. The four levels outlined below will be used to determine the base amount.

Service Area	Population Range	Base Levels	Base Funding
Small Rural	0 - 19,999	I	\$50,000
Medium Rural/Small Urban	20,000 -100,000	II	\$90,000
Urban	100,001 - 999,999	III	\$300,000
Large Urban	1,000,000 +	IV	\$600,000

Multi-County Supplement CAAs that serve more than one county will receive \$15,000 for each additional county served.

Persons in Poverty 2013 These are the 2013 poverty estimates from U.S. Census Bureau, Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE).

Percent of State Poor This is the relative percent of the state's poverty population in each county based on the 2013 poverty estimates.

Poverty Funding These are the amount of funds that are allocated to each agency based on the relative percent of poverty in each county.

SFY 2016 Formula Amount This column represents the total funds available (base funding plus poverty funding).

Proportional Sharing This column represents the proportional share of funding that will be used to allocate funding in future State Fiscal Years (SFYs) until the next Federal Decennial Census has been completed or the funding formula is revised through the public hearing process.
