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
DCFS Vision and Mission

Vision: Safe, Healthy, and Thriving Kids in Every Nevada Community



Summary of Agency Operations



Residential Services: provides services in twenty-four hour facilities including three juvenile justice facilities and four children's mental health facilities. Services include education, behavioral health treatment, medical treatment, recreation, family engagement, and discharge planning.

<u>Community Services</u>: provides case management services to youth in the rural child welfare, juvenile justice, and children's mental health systems. This includes but is not limited to child protection services in the rural counties, adolescent mobile crisis services in the two urban counites, early childhood mental health services, youth parole services statewide, and wraparound case facilitation statewide.

Quality & Oversight: provides system planning and oversight for the child welfare, juvenile justice, and children's mental health systems. This includes compliance with federal and state law requirements, quality assurance reviews, policy development, and statewide initiatives.

Administrative: provides fiscal and information services support to direct care staff. This includes management of the UNITY system for child welfare agencies and the grant management unit which is the largest state funder of victim services in the state.
