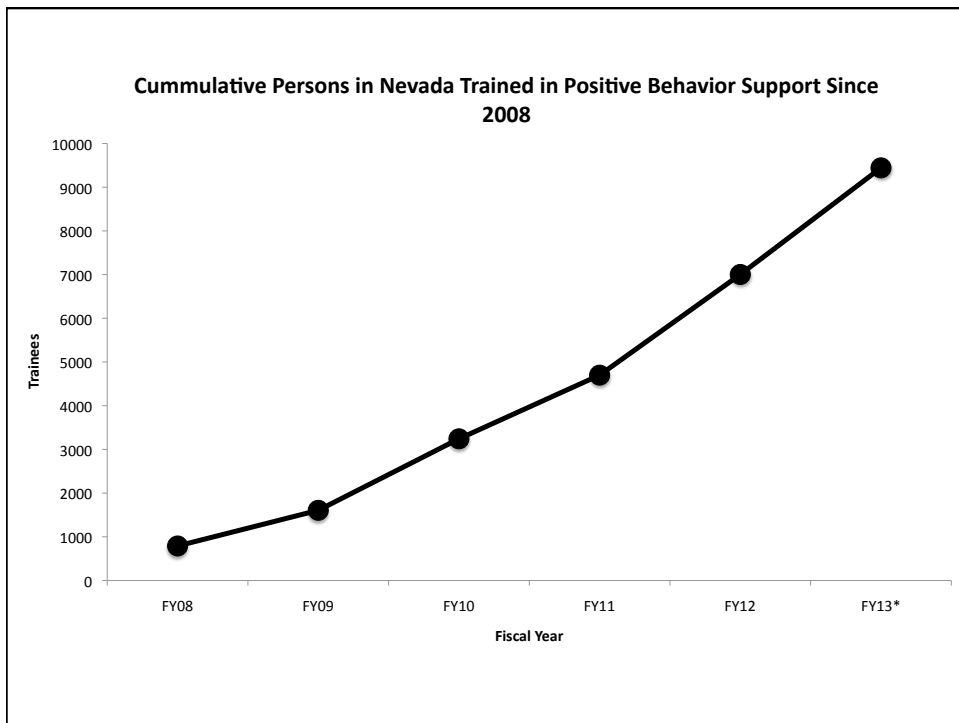
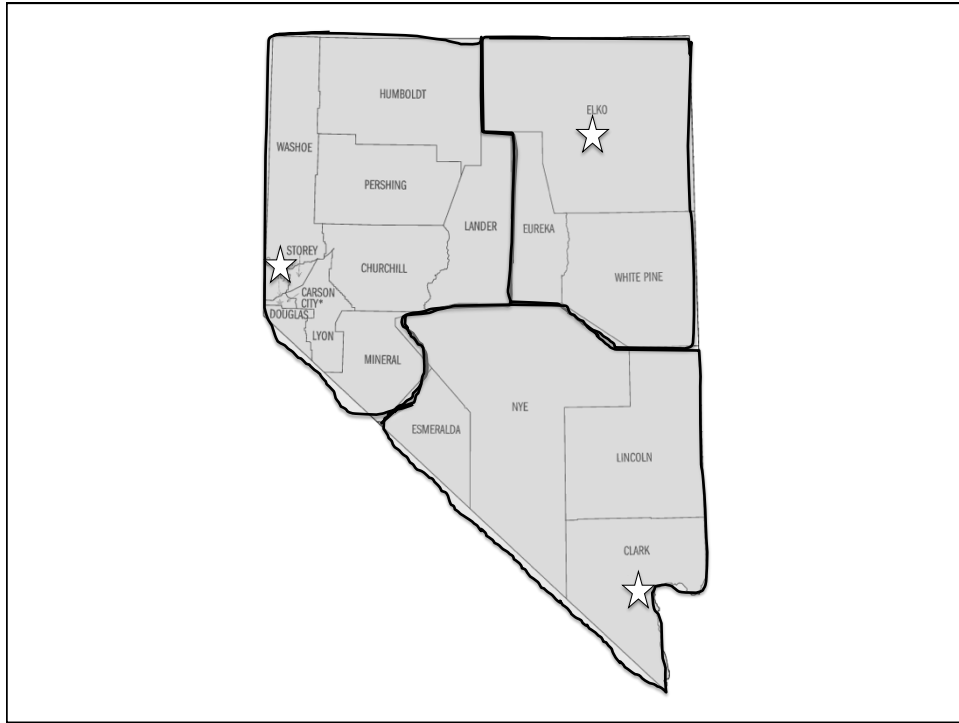


FUNDING HISTORY AND OUTCOME DATA

FY08-FY14**





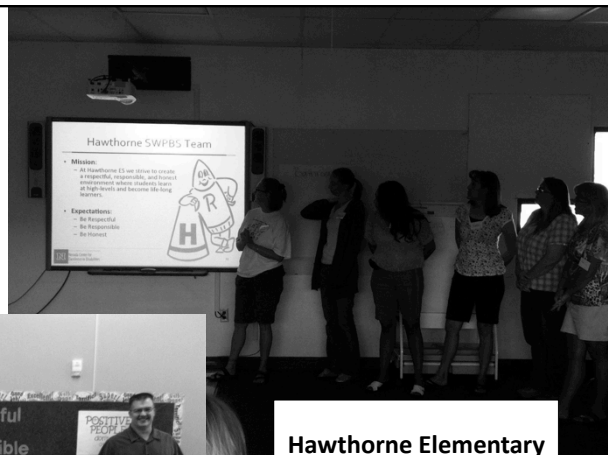

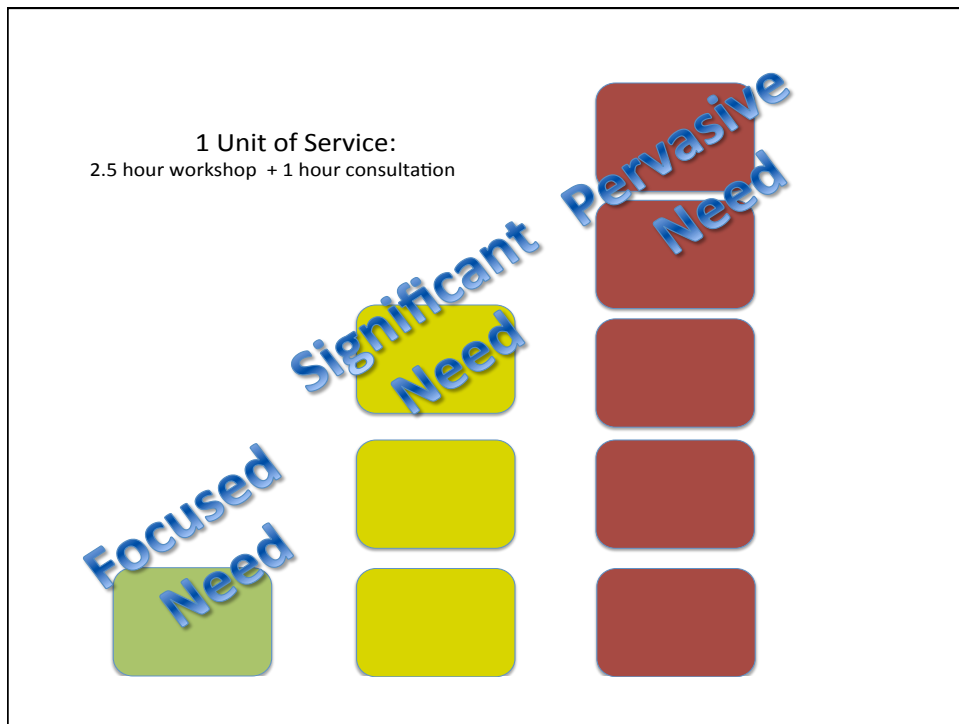
