The following table is reflective of the results of a survey administered to Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) service recipients in May of 2011. This survey is a tri-annual federal requirement. The written survey was administered to service recipients through the CSBG grantees at the request of the Grants Management Unit (GMU). The grantees then compiled and submitted their data to the GMU. This is a summary of that data.

- Each County is listed by column and the number of respondents is listed directly below the identified county
- The information entered in the left column reflects the top twelve areas of need in order of priority as reported by the agencies.
- The number assigned under each county's column reflects of the order of priority assigned by the survey responses. Example: Carson City reports the needs in order of ranking as: 1) employment, 2) dental care, 3) health care, 4) food, and 5)housing/shelter.
- The last column on the right reflects the total # of the survey participants and aggregate scores.
- The aggregate scores were developed by assigning the priority numbers weighted scores as follows: the #1 priority received five points, the # 2 priority received four points, the #3 priority received 3 points, the #4 priority receive two points and the #5 priority received one point. These weighted scores were averaged to reach the over all aggregate scores which established the over all state priorities as identified in this survey.
- In two instances, Lyon County and Clark County *, the ranking of health and dental care were combined as one item. In this chart they are reported with the equivalent rank.
- The Frontier Counties of Elko, Landers did not submit their statistical information from the survey.
