Federal Funding for Services “Received Through” an IHS/Tribal Facility and Furnished to Medicaid-Eligible American Indians and Alaska Natives

SHO#16-002

1. “Received Through” includes any service that the IHS/Tribal facility is authorized to provide according to IHS rules, and covered under the approved Medicaid State Plan. To include:

- Long Term Support Services
- Transportation and other travel related expenses

2. Services may be considered “received through” when an IHS/Tribal facility practitioner requests services, for his or her patient, from a non-IHS/Tribal provider (outside the IHS/Tribal facility). The patient must remain in the IHS/Tribal facility practitioner’s care.

- Non-IHS/Tribal provider must be enrolled as a Medicaid rendering provider
- IHS/Tribal provider must be enrolled as a Medicaid rendering provider
- There must be an established relationship between patient and IHS/Tribal Facility qualified practitioner
- IHS/Tribal facility is responsible for overseeing patient’s care
- IHS/Tribal facility retains control of patient’s medical records

3. There must be a care coordination agreement that involves:

- IHS/Tribal facility practitioner provides a request for specific services and relevant information about patient to non IHS/Tribal provider
- Non IHS/Tribal provider sends patient information regarding care (results of screening, diagnostic and treatment) to IHS/Tribal facility
- IHS/Tribal facility practitioner assumes responsibility for patient’s care by assessing information and taking appropriate action (furnishing or requesting additional services)
- IHS/Tribal facility incorporates patient information into medical records through Health Information Exchange or other agreed-upon means.

4. Options for how services may be billed to Medicaid: Information remains uncertain as there are many different interpretations and questions. CMS is in the process of addressing additional guidance to further clarify.

- Non-IHS/Tribal provider may bill Medicaid agency directly and will be reimbursed at the Medicaid state plan applicable rate to the provider type and service rendered.

Benefit	Challenge
-Would not be dependent on IHS/Tribal facility for reimbursement -Reduces state general fund expenditures for AI/AN recipients -Choice model, voluntary	-System limitation to separate FMAP at claim level -More administrative work for non-IHS/Tribal provider for same rate -Access to care changes uncertain -Waiting on CMS additional guidance

IHS/Tribal facility may bill Medicaid agency directly for the Non-IHS/Tribal services “received through” and will be paid at the applicable Medicaid state plan applicable rate for the provider type and services rendered.

Benefit	Challenge
-Increase access to care through care coordination agreements -Reduces state general fund expenditures for AI/AN recipients -Choice model, voluntary -Defined “facility” services, may still be paid at the all inclusive encounter rate – opportunity for maximizing 5 encounters -Services outside of “facility” definition potential to bill CPT codes -Claims and reimbursement tracking tied to PT 47	-System addition of CPT codes -Identifying “non” facility services and creating separation between Tribal facility service and an IHS facility services - More administrative work for non-IHS/Tribal providers -Waiting on CMS additional guidance
