NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

This hearing will be conducted in accordance with NRS 241.020, Nevada's Open Meeting Law.

Members of the public may make oral comments at this meeting. Persons wishing to submit written testimony or documentary evidence may submit the material to the Drug Transparency program by April 8th at the following email address: <u>drugtransparency@dhhs.nv.gov</u>

The proposed changes to NAC 439 include the following:

- Sections 2-6 of the proposed amendment define terms related to reporting information relating to prescription drugs.
- Section 7 of the proposed regulation sets forth the process for the appointment of hearing officers.
- Section 8 of the proposed regulation sets forth the process for notification of the imposition of an administrative penalty.
- Section 9 of the proposed regulation sets forth the process for an appeal of the imposition of an

administrative penalty.

- Sections 10-12 of the proposed regulation sets forth the process for a hearing and decision on the appeal of the imposition of an administrative penalty.
- Section 13-14 of the proposed regulation adds the term wholesaler to NAC 439.730, 439.735 and makes conforming changes pursuant to SB 380 from the 81st Session of the Nevada Legislature.
- Section 15 makes conforming changes to NAC 439.740 pursuant to SB 380 from the 81st Session of the Nevada Legislature.
- 1. Anticipated effects on the business which NAC 439B regulates:
 - a. Adverse effects: The proposed amendments are not expected to have any adverse effect on businesses.
 - b. *Beneficial effects*: The proposed amendments provide a mechanism for an appeals process of the penalty that will be beneficial to the businesses.
 - c. *Immediate:* Upon passage the Department will implement the appeals process for any penalty imposed upon the businesses.
 - d. *Long-term:* This process will remain in place for any future imposition of penalties against the businesses.
- 2. Anticipated effects on the public:
 - a. *Adverse:* There is no anticipated adverse impact on the public.
 - b. *Beneficial:* This amendment adds wholesalers to the reporting process and that increases transparency. That is beneficial to the public.
 - c. Immediate: There is no anticipated immediate effect on the public.
 - d. *Long*-Term: The included wholesaler information will be incorporated into the data collected by the transparency program. That is beneficial to the public.
- 3. No new costs are anticipated for enforcement of the proposed regulation.
- 4. There are no changes to a fee schedule.
- 5. The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any other Nevada state regulations.
