NOTICE OF INTENT TO AWARD FOR FUND FOR A RESILIENT NEVADA

This communication serves as the official Notice of Intent to Award subgrant agreements for the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the Fund for a Resilient Nevada (FRN) released on March 1, 2023, and due on April 7, 2023.

This open and competitive procurement process ensures Nevada is compliant with the Code of Federal Regulations (2 CFR Chapter 200 and 45 CFR Chapter 75), *Nevada Revised Statutes* (NRS Chapter 333), and *Nevada Administrative Code* (NAC Chapter 333).

The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Director's Office, received 13 applications for FRN Treatment Funds. Based on the recommendations of the evaluation committee, the following providers were selected to move forward with funding. DHHS reserves the right to modify this list based on available funding and competitiveness of applications. The evaluation committee also recommended several applications be considered for State Opioid Response Funding and/or block grant funding- these applicants will be notified directly.

The DHHS appreciates the applicants who submitted to serve Nevada's populations. In compliance with NRS and NAC, the applicants are identified below alphabetically and based on program target area, subject to available funding.

This Notice of Intent to Award does not constitute a contract, agreement, or obligation to fund. No authorizations or encumbrances shall be authorized until such time the fixed-amount *Notice of Subaward* is complete and signed by both the State and Provider. The agreement is subject to and contingent upon the successful negotiation of final terms of the subgrant, to include any conditions of award.

The provider must meet any conditions of award which may include, but are not limited to, approved scope of work, a program or site audit, risk assessment, demonstrated ability to collect data in compliance with the opioid recoveries/litigation requirements, compliance with a robust Electronic Health Records (EHR) system for data reporting, and demonstrated ability or plan to submit monthly program and fiscal reports. The Notice of Intent does not oblige the state to fund at the level requested.
