

## Notice of Funding Opportunity for

## Fund for a Healthy Nevada – Family Resource Centers (FRCs)

## **Questions and Answers**

The Department of Health and Human Services, Grants Management Unit posted a Notice of Funding Opportunity for Fund for a Healthy Nevada, a one-time funding opportunity for Family Resource Centers or other eligible non-profit organizations on Monday, January 27, 2025.

The deadline for question submissions was on or before Monday, February 3, 2025, 5:00 PM PST.

Question	Answer
Do we need to include the cost of eLogic in the budget of this grant?	No.
Regarding indirect, our rent and utilities, etc. all have to come out of indirect – 8%?	Yes, rent can be cost allocated to a grant, meaning a portion of your overall rent expense can be charged to a specific grant depending on the amount of space used by the grant-related activities, typically considered an "indirect cost" that needs to be calculated based on a reasonable allocation method like square footage used by the project.
Can you provide more information regarding the assigned database and what information will need to be collected and entered into this database?	The current database system is eLogic and is paid for by the State. Data entered may include client demographics, services provided, community outreach events, etc. If awarded funding, training on this system will be provided.
Can you clarify the application question "Sustainability plan for proposed project after 6/30/27?"	The sustainability plan should explain how FRC operations would continue past this upcoming funding period – i.e.: other funding sources that would ensure operations would continue.

Question	Answer
Is the FRC council a regional council or does the funded agency develop the council based on the specific project?	If not already established by a funded agency, a council must be developed to meet the requirements of NAC 430A.131 and FRC-104 of the <u>FRC Policies and Procedures</u> .
Our agency has existing committees that may meet the requirements for the FRC council, can this be used or do we need to create a new one if funded?	Yes, as long as the requirements of NAC 430A.131 and FRC-104 of the <u>FRC Policies and Procedures</u> are met, an existing council or committee may be utilized.
We already have an intake process, release of information, assessments, goal planning, etc., but do we need to use the specific forms designed by DHHS?	A funded agency may use their own processes and forms.
For reporting, do we need to report all client information as well as we would not be able to provide any personally identifying data to the funder?	We do not collect personally identifying information, only demographic and service provision data.
