Dear Director Whitley:

On behalf of the Home Care Employment Standards Board (HCESB) created by Senate Bill (SB) 340, it has been recommended that the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) refer the matter of discrimination faced by home care workers to the appropriate state body and assert that an industry-wide investigation be conducted with the goal of developing policy solutions to systemic racism in the field, such as annual reporting by employers to safeguard against discrimination.

The motion calling for this recommendation passed by the Board during the October 4, 2022, HCESB meeting and fulfills Section 16.2(f) SB 340:

The impact of systemic racism and economic injustice on home care employees and the adequacy of efforts to alleviate such impact through the development of career paths through partnerships between labor and management and other methods.

Through its committee on Systemic Racism and Economic Injustice, the HCESB has heard of numerous experiences of home care workers facing discrimination based on their race. Workers, employers, and consumers have all voiced concerns about differences in pay, opportunities, assignments, hours, and treatment. Because of the dispersed nature of the workforce, it is insufficient to rely on individual caregivers filing complaints.
