










The Design Sessions are structured so that stakeholders can move through these decisions in an intentional, sequential manner.

### **Affordability Questions**

#### **Questions to Consider**

- What specific population should the public option target (e.g., individual and small group markets, Marketplace-eligible but uninsured, undocumented residents, or by geography or age?)
- For that population, are reduced premiums or reduced cost-sharing (e.g., deductibles, co-pays) a greater barrier?
- Are there other affordability challenges that should be addressed (e.g., family glitch, rural counties)?
- How might the rate review process be used to provide State oversight and assistance in meeting premium reduction targets?

# Balancing Provider Contracting and Cost Control

#### **Questions to Consider**

- How should the State and health plans consider balancing robust provider participation with the stated premium reduction objectives?
- What tools will the State have to ensure plans and providers agree to fair rates?
- How do issues related to provider contracting (e.g., access and contracting) differ across rural and urban providers?
- Are there provider contracting and value-based care opportunities to improve equity, access, and culturally competent care? Are there successful models in Nevada?
- How might the State align its purchasing strategies, cost-controls, and value-based care between its Medicaid MCOs and Exchange initiatives?


# Benefits, Strengthening the Marketplace, and Licensure/Oversight

- What additional policies might strengthen the State's individual and small group market (e.g., reinsurance pool, financial and other reporting requirements, others)?
- How will oversight of the public option differ from oversight of other QHPs?
